Preparing for your Presentation Portfolio

The Renaissance Academy Commencement Project Presentation

As a senior, the student should be finished with his/her work in the field and will be concentrating on the final Presentation Portfolio. There are two components of this portfolio: The Written Report and the Oral Presentation. Upon completion of the Presentation Portfolio, the student will earn .5 credit hours toward graduation.

Written Report: In a written essay, the graduating senior needs to communicate two elements. The first element is a detailed summary of the project: research and preparation, process of implementation and completion, and a summary of resources used. Secondly, the written report involves a great deal of personal reflection. This three to five page paper will be evaluated on its authenticity, organization, mechanics and format. MLA format can be used as a guideline. Pictures, letters, or other documents are encouraged.

Oral Presentation: The 15 minute oral presentation should be complete with visual aids and other forms of creative presentation materials. The presence of technology in the oral presentation should be very evident to the evaluation team.

The Final Presentation Portfolio should be submitted with a Self-Evaluation, Time Log. and One-Page Summary. All student work should be saved on Student Shared – "Class of 2016 Senior Projects"/Student Last Name/Assignment Name. The student will present their project for evaluation with the Renaissance Academy Staff.

Reflection Questions for Presentation Portfolio

Project Purpose:

- What were my goals and objectives?
- Explain the project plan and implementation.
- What problems did I encounter?
- How did I resolve these problems?
- How did I apply my high school course work? Detail the evidence of application.
- How did I integrate the Core Values into this project?
- Was I able to meet the goals?

Interaction with Others:

- Describe and give examples of the effects that this project has had on me. How was I affected (positively and negatively) by the people involved in this project?
- Describe and give examples of the effects that I have had on the people with whom I interacted during this project. What have they learned from me?

Personal Growth:

- What life lessons have I learned as a result of being involved in this project?
- If I were to begin the project over again, would the topic be the same? Why? What would I have done differently?



Self-Evaluation

The graduating senior will have the opportunity to honestly evaluate the progress of the project from the student's perspective.

One Page Summary

A one-page summary will highlight the project objective with a picture and a quote from the student's written report. The student's name and project title should also be included. The one-page summary will serve as an introduction on the door of the presentation room and Commencement Project bulletin board in the lobby.

- Reviewing the Written Plan, was it an active plan, detailed enough to be useful?
- Considering the project goals, did the project accomplish what you expected?
- This project gives the student a leadership role to accomplish the project goals. Considering the student was the leader, were the expectations effectively communicated during all stages of the project?
- Were the time line dates and objectives consistently met?
- What are the project strengths?
- In planning staging of this project, what would be done differently to improve the project?
- What were the most challenging aspects of this project?
- Optional: If you were in charge of the Commencement Project, what would you change in the process of planning, executing, and presenting your project?
