II. Needs/Problems

I would like to help the children, from first to sixth grade, who don't have the materials or opportunities to go to school, especially at my adopted school (Beta Atea School) in the Philippines.

- Although, there have been organizations that have helped this cause, this is still a
 major problem in the Philippines. There are still many children that do not or can not
 afford to go to school.
- Children are less likely to go to school due to many reasons:
 - o Lack of financial support. The children buy food for the family rather than spending money to go to school.
 - o Lack of parental support. The children especially the eldest, then lead to take care of the siblings and the household.
 - o Disease/Sickness in the family. The children start working at early age to support the family.

I would like to help and provide my services at the hospital as a volunteer.

III. Goals/Objectives

- Goal #1: to have experience with helping children and to experience a different culture and surroundings.
- Goal #2: to give back to a community of children so they can have the chance to go to school, I would like to collect a grades worth of supplies to give to children so they can succeed in school.
- Goal #3: to work with children and experience volunteer work at a hospital to see my options in the medical field

IV. Procedures/Scope of Work

- Plan a trip to the Philippines and talk to my aunt, who owns a major shoe company (VANS) and gives shoes and supplies to Beta Atea School. Also talk to the school that I am visiting to let them know that I am coming.
- 2. Fly to the Philippines and meet with my aunt
- 3. Visit Beta Atea School stay there for a whole school day talking to the students and teachers and help out when needed
 - a. Bring food for all the kids
 - b. Take foot sizes of all the kids to give them shoes for their annual sports fest
- 4. Fly back to America

- 5. Start planning Fundraiser (school supplies) to send back to my adopted school before the 2011 school year starts (around June)
 - a. Renaissance Academy
 - i. Give each homebase a plain tote bag and inform them that they are to decorate each bag creatively and fill them up with school supplies for students who are from second grade to sixth grade.
 - ii. Grade with the most given supplies or students who bring a certain amount of supplies will get a dress down
 - b. Karate Studio
 - i. Talk to my instructor to set a fundraiser for my senior project and set up a box for this cause.
- 6. Collect all supplies in March-April
- 7. Ship all supplies to the Philippines by May 2011
- 8. Summer of 2011
 - a. Volunteer at Phoenixville Hospital or CHOP to get experience in working at a hospital
